Welcome to the Urgent Care Centre at St Mary's Hospital

The new Urgent Care Centre (UCC) will provide the best possible care for patients with non-life threatening injuries and illnesses.

The Urgent Care Centre is located within the Accident and Emergency Department of St Mary's Hospital. It is staffed by experienced general practitioners (GPs) and emergency nurse practitioners.

By locating these services together, patients will receive the right care in the right place at the right time.

Please note: for locally registered patients with a minor illness, or a long-term health problem (diabetes, high blood pressure, or asthma), it is always better to see your own GP. The Urgent Care Centre will however treat patients in the event that they cannot be seen by their own GP.

How does the Urgent Care Centre work?

On arrival at the centre you will be assessed promptly by a GP or an emergency nurse to determine what services are required to treat your condition and who should treat you.

Patients with minor injuries and non-life threatening medical problems will be treated

Opening times

The Urgent Care Centre is open from 10am to 7pm, seven days a week.
Outside these hours patients will be treated in Accident and Emergency (A&E).

The Accident and Emergency Department is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Patients with more serious medical problems will be referred immediately to be assessed and treated in the Accident and Emergency Department.

Is the Urgent Care Centre the right place for me to be seen?

If you have a minor injury (cuts, sprains, bruises) or mild illness (cough, ear infection, sore throat) you will be seen by a GP or emergency nurse practitioner in the Urgent Care Centre. You may be directed to a local pharmacy, dental service, or other community service such as an NHS walk-in centre.

Depending on the problem, patients may be advised to see their own GP. Staff in the Urgent Care Centre will provide information to help patients register with a GP if necessary.

The Accident and Emergency Department is for patients who require immediate medical advice, diagnosis and/or emergency treatment. This will be for serious or life threatening injuries and illnesses.
